LOFT BEDS, MICRO-FRIDGES, & MICROWAVES

Because most of our furniture in the residence halls is built-in and not movable (unless you are assigned to a house or Crusader Court) the University does not encourage loft beds. In most cases they will provide no additional floor space. However, the University does not prevent their use if the following guidelines are met. The University has a limited number of loft beds for rent. Please see below for loft rental information.

Students must sign a loft bed “waiver” of liability before a loft can be placed in the room. The loft bed waiver will be available the day of check-in.

Lofts must be free-standing. Bolts, nails, chains, etc. cannot be sunken, attached or adhered in any way to the walls, floors, ceilings and/or existing bed frames to support the loft. Lofts must be sturdy.

Desks, dressers or other university furniture, except the bed frame, must not be used to support the loft. All wood used in construction must be treated with a fire-retardant substance (Paint or Stain).

Lofts must be located and constructed in such a way that they do not interfere with access to windows, air conditioning, heat ing, plumbing units, smoke detectors or other items requiring periodic maintenance.

Lofts must NEVER block the doorways to a student’s room.

After being lofted, the top of the mattress must be at least 30” below the ceiling.

A ladder is recommended for each loft. Lofts must be bolted and not nailed.

Lofts may not be decorated with flammable materials. No University furniture can be removed from the room.

Bolt tips must not stick out more than four threads past the nut.

Lofts are subject to periodic safety checks by Residential Services and/or the Maintenance Staff.

Lofts can be left in place during the summer only if permission is granted by the Office of Student Engagement and the student is returning to the same room in the fall. Otherwise, the loft must be removed before the check-out process is completed. Be aware that most of our facilities are used over the summer sessions for camp and your loft may be used if left during the summer.

We suggest looking on the internet for loft plans. The University does not provide measurements for lofts. You may make an appointment to come on campus during the summer and make any necessary measurements.

NORTH GREENVILLE LOFT RENTALS

North Greenville has a limited number of loft beds for rent. Our lofts are made of tubular steel and tested up to 1,000 lbs. The lofts use the existing mattress and assemble in less than 15 minutes.

Due to size restraints, the rental lofts are only allowed in: Anthony, Brashier, Bruce, Cline, Crusader Court Duplexes, Emery, Hartness, Horton-Tingle, J.R. Howard, Roberson, and campus houses. NGU loft beds can be rented for \$100 for the academic year and if desired, can be delivered and set up on check-in day for a \$50 set up fee. These lofts will be available on a first come-first serve basis during check-in week.

LAUNDRY

NGU, in agreement with Mac-Gray, provides free laundry service on campus. All of the machines are energy-efficient front-load machines.

MICRO-FRIDGE & MICROWAVES

Students can bring a micro-fridge and/or microwave for their room. NGU does not provide fridges or microwaves. Only one fridge and/or microwave per room is allowed, so please coordinate with your roommates.

STUDY TIME

PLEASE DO NOT BRING

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE **NOT** ALLOWED BY UNIVERSITY POLICY:

Electrical appliances with exposed coils, air conditioners, air coolers, space heaters, toaster ovens, slow cookers, grease cookers, electrical skillet, hot plates.

Hoverboards—This policy is mandated by our insurance company.

Pets—Sorry, pets are prohibited with the exception of fish in small tanks.

Guns, weapons of any kind, fireworks and explosives are strictly prohibited.

Water beds—These are prohibited because of weight and leaks.

Darts and Dartboards

Alcohol, drugs, tobacco—North Greenville University is an alcohol/drug/tobacco-free campus.

Posters that advertise alcohol, drugs, tobacco or other lewd or vulgar material, in any manner.

Nails or screws (**See the Student Handbook for instructions on hanging items on the residence hall walls.**)

Drop Cords/Extension Cords of any kind—Only multi-plugs with surge protectors are allowed in the resident halls. This policy is mandated by the fire marshal.

Oil scented/based air fresheners —These are not allowed due to maintenance and safety issues.

REMEMBER THE FOLLOWING WHEN DECORATING YOUR ROOM

- 1) On cinder block walls or sheet rock walls, **ONLY** blue masking tape or 3M command type hangers may be used to hang pictures, posters, etc. Blue tape and 3M command type hangers must be carefully removed. **Double-sided tape may not be used** in the residence halls.
- 2) On wood paneled walls, **ONLY** thumbtacks may be used to hang pictures, posters, etc. Nails & screws of any size **MAY NOT** be used. 3M command type hangers may be used but must be carefully removed.
- 3) The following **MAY NOT** be used on any surface in a residence hall room: paint, **double-sided tape**, duct tape, packing tape, contact paper, nails, screws, poster putty or glue.
